

# "Christianity and War"

As I write this article, the Ukraine-Russia tensions are at an all-time high. I wouldn't be totally shocked if by the time you read this article, Russia will have already invaded the Ukraine. All this talk of war and unrest brought me to, once again, think about war and the Christian response. Can Christians rightly fight in a war?

This question has caused a lot of division in the body of Christ. Should a Christian go to war where he might kill other people when the Bible says to "turn the other cheek" (Luke 6:29)? Is it right to do war against others or does the Bible forbid it?

War is a state of declared, open, and armed conflict between two or more nations. It is sometimes undertaken in self-defense such as when the U.S. entered WWII as a result of Japan attacking Pearl Harbor. Other times, however, nations unjustly go to war to take spoils from other countries. Murder, on the other hand, is an unlawful taking of life and is always wrong. When nations go to war, it is declared lawful by the countries going to war — some-

times for moral reasons and other times for immoral reasons.

Therefore, an immoral war could be considered a form of murder where a moral war could be in self-defense. The short answer is, not all war is wrong. Even still, war is a result of sin! But to defend yourself is not wrong.

It is difficult to determine when the war would be a righteous endeavor given that leaders of nations are not ruling with that Bible as their sole guide and could easily have ungodly reasons for going to war.

Nevertheless, war is an unfortunate reality in this world, and it causes great destruction, misery, and loss of life. It should be avoided if possible and undertaken only as a last resort.

The Bible teaches that we have the right to self-defense. If we apply biblical principles to war, I conclude that war can be justifiable when it is in self-defense and/or when it is to protect the innocent. Therefore, a Christian could rightfully engage in war given those conditions.

In the Old Testament, we read that God sends people into war. In fact, God uses war as a means of disciplining nations. Also, the Lord is called a warrior. Furthermore, Christians are instructed to be in subjection to the governing authorities whose establishment is from God. This establishment has the right to declare war and to punish its citizenry, even by capital punishment.

Finally, notice that some soldiers approached John the Baptist and inquired about repentance. John did not tell them to stop being soldiers, but to do their jobs properly, honestly. "And some soldiers were questioning him, saying, "And what about us, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Do not take money from anyone by force, or accuse anyone falsely, and be content with your wages," (Luke 3:14).

From all of this, we can see that war is a result of living in a sin filled world. Nation fighting nation was not God's desire at creation. However, for the Christian...going to war is not wrong in itself and that a Christian can go to war under the right circumstances.

We always pray that wars could be avoided. And now especially we pray for a peaceful solution with Russia and Ukraine. May God grant wisdom to the leaders of all countries involved.



# Cooking with Pastor Senstad

### Classic Meatloaf

Sometimes a person just needs a good old classic meal. It doesn't get much more original than a meatloaf with oatmeal. I grew up on it. With meatloaf, spaghetti and a half-dozen hot dishes, you pretty much covered the menu. Hot dogs and hamburgers were a sometime treat.

#### **Ingredients:**

I-I/2 Pound(s) ground beef (96% lean) or turkey breast (99% lean)

3/4 Cup(s) Quaker Oats

(quick or old fashioned, uncooked)

3/4 Cup(s) finely chopped onion

1/2 Cup(s) ketchup

I Egg, lightly beaten

I Tablespoon(s) Worcestershire

sauce or soy sauce

2 Clove(s) Garlic, minced

1/2 Teaspoon(s) Salt

I/4 Teaspoon(s) Black pepper



#### **Instructions:**

- I. Heat oven to 350°F.
- 2. In large bowl, combine all ingredients, mixing lightly but thoroughly.
- 3. Shape meatloaf mixture into  $10 \times 6$ -inch loaf on rack of broiler pan.
- 4. Bake 50 to 60 minutes or until meatloaf is medium doneness (160°F for beef, 170°F for turkey). Let stand 5 minutes before slicing. Cover and

refrigerate leftovers promptly and use within 2 days, or wrap airtight and freeze up to 3 months.

#### Ephesians 3:19

"And to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God"

#### Why this verse?

In this verse, Paul was praying for his friends in Ephesus. And one of the chief requests of his prayer was for the Ephesian church to experience Christ's love. He prayed for them "to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge." Paul wasn't saying it was impossible to know the love of God. He was simply stating that we couldn't fully know the love of God. We can't comprehend the depth of God's love because it's too big and strong for us to understand fully. For example, you can know that there are stars in the sky — walk out your front door at night, take a look skyward, and there you go. But can you fully know and understand how many stars there are? How deep into our galaxy they go? We can make educated guesses, but there are countless stars beyond the capabilities of even our best telescopes. The same is true when considering the love of God. If you know God, then you know love because God is love. But His love is so deep that it stretches beyond our capacity of understanding. God's love engulfs us like the ocean with unexplorable depths.

#### 'When We Least Expect It'

This last month has been a good reminder that our Lord is at work in ways we don't always expect. Our English class numbers have been especially small since beginning again after Christmas—sometimes just 3 or 4 students. Our hunch is that the recent wave of omicron COVID-19 cases is behind the situation, but we are not sure. I have been concerned about making new connections with our Hispanic neighbors when so few are coming. And yet, in spite of the uncertainty, some exciting (and unexpected) things have been happening: I.) A visitor who has come to our Spanish divine service for three weeks in a row has asked to begin studying the Bible and the Small Catechism. 2.) One ESL student has stayed after classes twice to talk to me about the Christian faith. Now, he has also asked to meet weekly to learn how to navigate and read the Bible. 3.) Back in November, I brought a turkey to a recently-arrived family from Guatemala for Thanksgiving (thanks to **Ed** and **Joyce** for the donation). That connection has led to more interactions, and now, their 12-year-old daughter will start the Bible stories with me on Monday evenings.

Again, all of this has seemed to happen suddenly and unexpectedly!

Twelve years go, when I was teaching 4th and 5th grade mathematics and science in Hawaii, I had a mentor who shared some words of wisdom with me: "in your first years, your students learn <u>in spite</u> of you. Later, they learn <u>with</u> you. Eventually, they learn <u>because</u> of you. Just relax because they will learn"

Now, as a pastor, I can't help but remember these words and apply them (at least on level) to the Church. <u>Jesus</u> is the Lord of <u>His</u> Church, and sometimes, He gives us glimpses of His work through us (or even in spite of us!) to remind us that He is indeed in control. And at times, He teaches this by opening doors and bringing people to us **when we least expect it!** I look forward to seeing where these developments lead next!

Staff reviews have been completed.


Redeemer will give up the Large-Print LWML Quarterly Project. We will be selling most of the equipment on eBay.
