

"Christian Education"

On **August 31**st we will resume our Wednesday midweek program. This includes both ROCK Wednesday and our Confirmation classes with a <u>parent / student orientation</u>: 6:00 pm for our younger children and 7:00 pm for our 6-8th graders.

It's an exciting time of the year for the church. It also makes us very busy and very happy! Why does it make us happy? Because it's an honor and a joy to work with our youth and help them learn about Jesus. But a more important question is, 'Why do we do it?'' Why does our congregation invest the time, energy and resources into our Christian education program?

The short answer is...because Christ commands us to teach in the great commission (Matt. 28:20). More than that, Christian education is important for all ages, especially youth. (Prov. 22:6) There is an old maxim that says, "Give us a child until he is seven, and we'll have him for life." That shows how critical it is to teach someone when they are young. Some claim that it was St. Ignatius Loyola that first authored that quote. I don't really know who first said it, but it's been frequently proven. If you need proof, I'm an example. Why do I still root for the Minnesota Vikings? (Believe me, I've asked myself that a time or two.) I suspect it's because of how I was raised. Knowing Christ from early on is very important.

Confirmation is vital because we are blessed with a short period of time to help our youth develop a deeper understanding of the faith that we Lutherans believe, teach and confess. First, in 6th grade we spend a great deal of time teaching key stories and facts of the Bible. As our catechism teaches us, "The Bible is divided into two parts, the Old Testament and the New Testament. There are 66 books in the Bible: 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament." Each year our students are asked to recite the names of the books of the Bible in the order that they are found in the Bible.

Then, in 7th and 8th grade we spend time digging deep into the doctrine of our church. Officially, the catechism states it this way,

"Confirmation is a public rite of the church preceded by a period of instruction designed to help baptized Christians identify with the life and mission of the Christian community."

During that time, we offer a wonderful opportunity for children to enrich their education about the stories and life of Jesus. And many of the hallmark events of the Bible are taught during ROCK Sunday, too.

I hope all of you are as excited as we on the staff are about the honor and privilege to teach and to learn about God: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The categories of designated gifts include: Mission; Mercy and Human Care; Concordia Scholarships; General Operations; Church Building and Property; Youth and Christian Education; Church Staff; and Technology and Worship. Undesignated gifts will be used for projects recommended by the Committee.

The Committee is to inform the Members of the Congregation of the purpose of the Fund and may arrange for the Member to meet with professional counselors regarding Charitable Giving, Wills, Bequests, Insurance, etc. James Schroeder, Christian Estate Planning Counselor for Iowa District West, is available to meet and advise anyone interested.

`7-LAYER SALAD'

- I pound bacon

August 2022 Bibi's Hope Update



The Anadolu Agency, a Turkish state-run news agency interviewed Bibi (Maly Sangho). This is a continuation of the interview from the last newsletter....

The Lord places Bibi in Turkey, and it saves her life

"When we started the interview, I told you that I am from two countries. I have two nationalities. It's not on paper. I am Malian because I was born in Mali. I'm Turkish because the first time I went to Istanbul I had a stroke that took me to the hospital. I stayed 29 days in a coma. It was in Istanbul, Turkey that I woke up again. The doctor later told my children that the operation had cost a lot of millions but that everything had been taken care of by the Turkish government, because I was on a mission," says Maly. "And why did I go to Turkey? Because the students of the Maarif school, came to see the children of the orphanage every month with the teacher, for seven successive years", she evokes in reference to the Turkish educational foundation present abroad. "So the Turks of Bamako decided to name me the best mother of the year in 2013 and I was invited to Turkey where I met everyone," recalls Maly Sangho.

I was given a year to live

"In Turkey, I was given a year of life expectancy in 2013, so I had to live until 2014. We are in 2022. So I can say that it was in Turkey that I found my life again . So I'm Turkish," she says in gratitude for the health care provided by her host country. "I therefore ask the Turkish government to allow me to help these children. Today, I need every child in this orphanage (who does not have the means and who has no parents) to be allowed to go to school and one day visit Turkey. There are many economic operators in Turkey who come to Bamako. There are some who have been to my house. The year is not a day, it's 365 days. And these children, they are 204 in number. They need visits every day for 365 days. They need to go to school. They need to be sponsored by people because sponsorship makes it possible to link an unhappy child to a benefactor who has a heart", she believes, expressing her immense sadness to see sad children. "Today, we need to build. This gem you see is land that was given away free of charge by the state. I salute the Malian government because at least I'm not renting today. I don't have a rent bill. I only have electricity bills. I need help," she continues.

"So, dear friends around the world, I invite you to come and visit us to see that the primary need is not just everyday life. There, we cling to a small thread. It's not just about food or clothes, it's also about where to live. We want children to be able to sleep peacefully without being bitten by mosquitoes. Small means cannot build. It takes a lot of bricks to make a house for a hundred children who are out in the street," concludes Maly Sangho, founder of the Niaber Orphanage in Bamako.
