### **Confession and Absolution**

P: Brothers and sisters, we all have a role to play as we help one another gain knowledge about our gracious God and wisdom to live out each day in faith. Adults are encouraged “to give prudence to the simple, knowledge and discretion to the youth,”

**Adults: but at times we do not know enough about our God to answer our children’s questions, and we struggle to decide how much discretion to offer our youth.**

P: Parents are to teach gently: “Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord,”

**Parents: but we do not always instruct as the Lord would want.**

P: John speaks for all parents when he writes, “I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth,”

**Children: but sometimes we are not sure that what we have been taught is the truth.**

P: Within the Church some are called specially to teach, as Paul writes, “And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers,”

**Teachers: but sometimes we might prefer to sit back and let others teach, and the calling feels like a demand instead of a gracious opportunity.**

P: The heart of the Bible is our Savior. Walking with two disciples Easter evening, “beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, Jesus interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself,”

**C: but sometimes we may be content to see the Bible as ancient history and not the revelation of God’s calling us to faith today.**

P: As we share our faith and go on to encourage one another in Christian living, the bar is set high: “Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that an opponent may be put to shame, having nothing evil to say about us.”

**C: We confess that we all fall short daily as we teach and learn, as we lead and follow. We ask for mercy from our gracious God.**

P: When the two disciples reflected on how Jesus taught them on Easter evening, they said to each other, “Did not our hearts burn within us while He talked to us on the road, while He opened to us the Scriptures?” When our Savior is the heart of our teaching and learning, then we have the Good News to assure us of the forgiveness of sins, all sins, for His sake. As a called and ordained servant of Christ I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

P: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, you are to be installed as [*Teachers & Helpers*] at Redeemer Lutheran Church, a work in which our Father in heaven has great joy. Hear the Word of the Lord: “Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.” Beloved in the Lord, you are to assist me, the minister of Word and Sacrament, in the instruction of God’s people according to His holy Word. You are to prepare yourselves for this work by your individual and corporate study of the Word of God and the

faith drawn from it as it has been delivered to us in the Small Catechism. - P: Beloved in the Lord, you have heard the promises of faithfulness spoken by these men and women. Do you promise to support them in their work, to remember them in your prayers, and to work with them to the best of the abilities that God has given you, so that He may be glorified and His work be done in our midst? If so, then answer: We do. **C: We do.**
- P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, I install you as [*Teachers & Helpers*] at Redeemer Lutheran Church in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

- P: And how about you children? Will you promise to listen to your parents, learning from them, and obey them, helping wherever you can? Will you focus on Christ as the heart of your learning? Will you set yourselves as examples of Christian living for your family and all you meet in daily living? If so, then answer: We will, by the grace of God. **Children: We will, by the grace of God.**
- P: Finally, I ask all of you: Will you study the Word of God when you have opportunity, here in church and with your families or friends? Will you endeavor to share the faith in your hearts, teaching others by word and example? Will you seek to exhibit Christ as the heart of your living? If so, then answer: We will, by the grace of God. **C: We will, by the grace of God.**

P: The almighty and most merciful God enlighten and strengthen you in your service that you may be good and faithful leaders and teachers in this congregation, and as teachers and learners in your daily living, to the glory of His name and the salvation of His people. **C: Amen.**

P: Go in the name of the Lord. Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. The almighty and most merciful God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless and preserve you. **C: Amen.**
