SEQUENCE 1 *Meet the Missionary: J. K. Wilhelm Loehe, Pastor*

P: Although he never traveled to any land that was distant from his native Germany, Pastor Loehe was a most effective missionary. Born in Germany in 1808, Pastor Loehe spent

most of his adult life as pastor at the Lutheran congregation in the little village of Neuendettelsau in Bavaria. As part of his ministry, he related the need for church workers in developing lands across the globe to German Lutherans and assisted in training what were called “emergency helpers” to be sent as missionary pastors to North and South America and even to Australia. Pastor Loehe raised funds to establish a theological training school in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and a teachers institute in Saginaw, Michigan. Because of his commitment to further the mission of Jesus Christ, congregations pastored by “Loehe’s men” were established in many locations around the world, and the Gospel was most joyfully proclaimed.

Pastor Loehe was known for his confessional commitment, his dedication to the historical Lutheran liturgy, and his devotion to works of Christian charity. Loehe understood and championed the centrality of the Lord’s Supper in the life of the Church and highlighted that liturgical commitment in his writings.

SEQUENCE 2 *Meet the Missionary: Patrick, Missionary to Ireland*

P: Among the best known of Christian missionaries is Patrick, whose missionary effort to bring the Gospel to northern and western Ireland in the fifth century is legendary. Born to a Christian family in Britain, he was captured as a teenager by Irish raiders and taken to Ireland, where he was forced to serve as a herdsman. After six years, he escaped. Following a special calling to serve God, he entered a monastery community. Although Patrick served faithfully in his monastic offices, he never lost the desire to return to Ireland to bring the good news of Jesus to the far reaches of the island. Ordained as a bishop in AD 432, he made his way back to Ireland and spent the rest of his life spreading the Gospel and organizing Christian congregations. He forged strong bonds between the Irish Church and the Christian communities located throughout the European continent.

Patrick, whose day on the commemoration calendar is March 17, was a confessional missionary. He strongly defended the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and found ways to relate the mysteries of God to the people he served throughout his long life.

SEQUENCE 3 *Meet the Missionary: Boniface of Mainz, Missionary to the Germans*

P: Although he was born in England around the year AD 673, Boniface is known as the Missionary to the Germans for it was in Germany that he served as a missionary, teacher, and church organizer. Boniface set a great example of missionary spirit as he reached out to people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout what today is Germany and areas of the Netherlands. Well into his senior years, Boniface continued to bring the light of Christ to those who had not heard the Gospel message. His earthly life ended when he and some missionary associates were murdered in Friesland by a group of people who thought Boniface was hiding treasure. But the true treasure that Boniface possessed was that which he freely gave out during his long life: the good news of God's abiding love for all people.

One famous episode from the life of Boniface was when he felled an oak tree that had been a symbol of pagan worship and then used the lumber to build a chapel near Geismar, in central Germany. Boniface was a missionary in both word and deed who is commemorated on June 5.

SEQUENCE 4 *Meet the Missionary: Friedrich Wyneken, Pastor and Missionary*

P: Remembered on the calendar of commemorations on May 4, Friedrich Wyneken was a major figure in American Lutheranism in the nineteenth century. Born in Verden, Germany, in 1810, he followed in the footsteps of his father and became a Lutheran pastor. As a young pastor, Wyneken traveled to the United States in 1838, arriving in the port of Baltimore. After helping an

older pastor, who was taken ill in Baltimore for a year, Wyneken was sent westward by the Pennsylvania ministerium of Lutherans to serve the spiritual needs of German farmers who had moved into Ohio, Indiana, and Michigan. Setting up a home base in Fort Wayne, Indiana, Pastor Wyneken became a classic “circuit rider” type of clergyman, often preaching to gatherings of Christian people who may not have heard a sermon for months if not years. Wyneken, who was financially supported by Lutheran people in Germany, expanded his outreach beyond German immigrants and reached out to Native American groups he encountered. Realizing the need for more pastors in the rapidly growing American heartland, he published “The Distress of the German Lutherans in North America.” Several German mission societies responded to his call for assistance, and many church workers were sponsored to come to the United States as missionaries through Pastor Wyneken’s efforts.

Friedrich Wyneken thrived in his new homeland and served as the second president of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, holding that office from 1850 to 1864. To continue the missionary work begun by Wyneken and other immigrant missionary pastors, many established congregations held mission festivals to raise support for ongoing mission efforts.
