P: "Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed."

**C: For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your Law and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name.**

P: "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you, and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ☩ Son and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**
